# About the Society of Engineers, United Kingdom

[Established: 1854] [→2005: IIE-UK→2006: IET-UK.]

The **Society of Engineers** was a British [learned society](#) established in 1854. It was the first society to issue the professional title of Incorporated Engineer. It merged with the [Institution of Incorporated Engineers](#) (IIE) in 2005, and in 2006 the merged body joined with the [Institution of Electrical Engineers](#) to become the [Institution of Engineering and Technology](#).

## Establishment

Established in May 1854 in [The Strand](#), London, the Society of Engineers was one of the oldest professional [engineering](#) bodies in the United Kingdom (after the [Smeatonian Society of Civil Engineers](#), 1771, the [Institution of Civil Engineers](#), 1818, and the [Institution of Mechanical Engineers](#), 1847)

It promoted the interests of members worldwide and was concerned with all branches of engineering. It was founded by [Henry Palfrey Stephenson](#) and Robert Monro Christie as a means of reunion for former students of [Putney](#) College (the short-lived [College for Civil Engineers](#), 1839–c.1851)— one of few institutions then giving technical and scientific training for engineers — with Stephenson serving as president in 1856 and 1859.<sup>[3]</sup>

To become a member the candidate was subjected to an examination divided into three parts:<sup>[5]</sup>

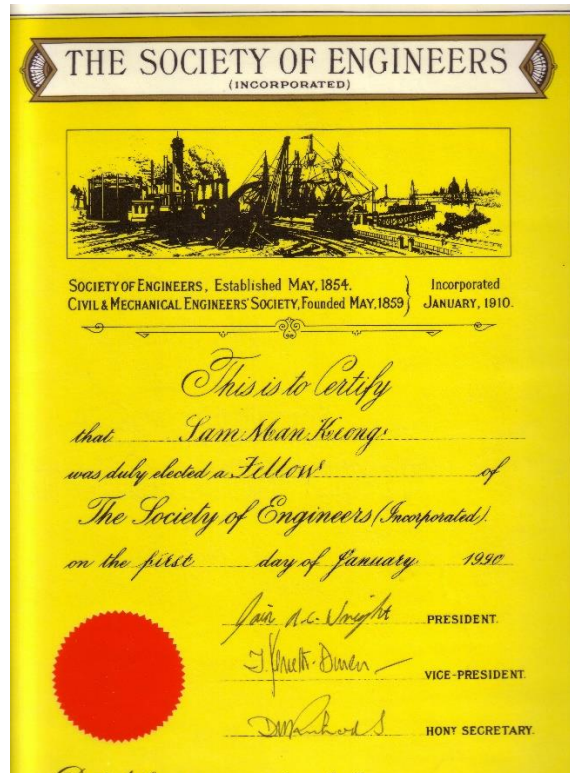
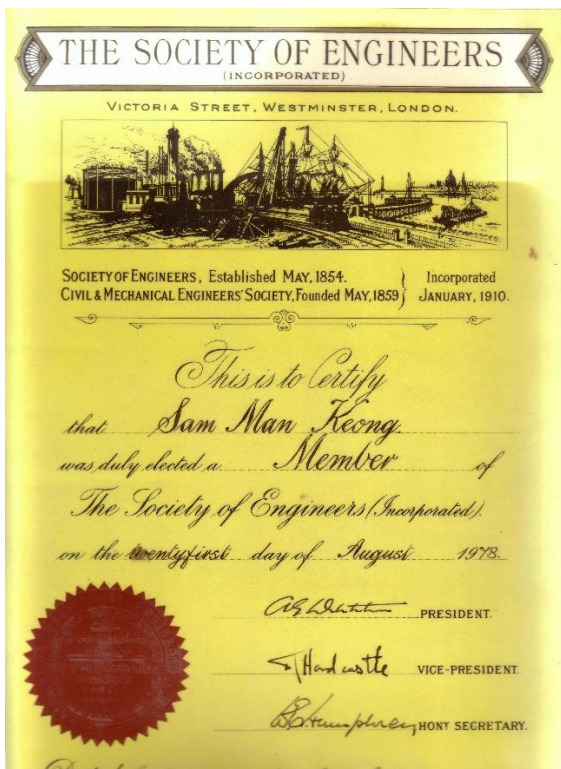
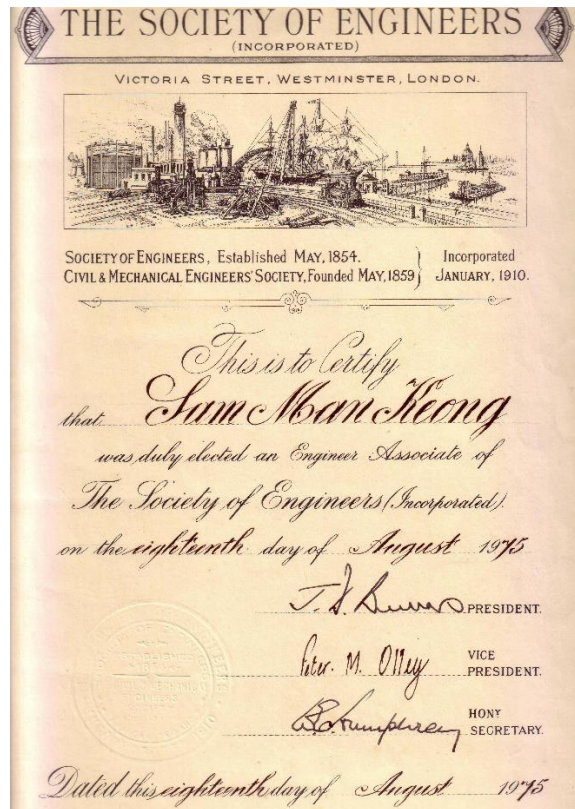
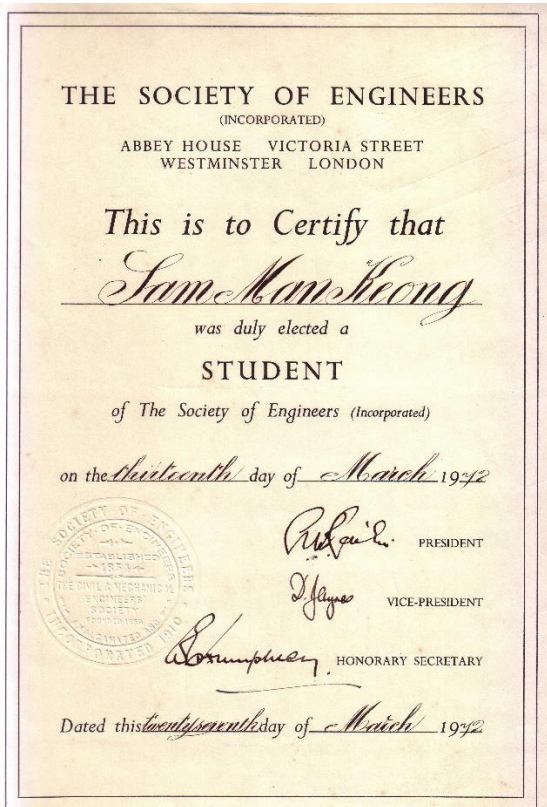

**[Established: 1969][→2018: IET-UK; →2018: SPEng International]**

(The Society of Professional Engineers -SPE) was established the United Kingdom in 1969, to promote the interests of skilled engineers in all the main branches of Engineering.

The main objective of the Society is to enhance the status of trained and experienced professional engineers in the absence in the UK of any legal protection for the title "**Engineer**". The founding members believed that this was necessary, as "Engineer" can be used by anyone in the UK, whether or not trained or experienced. This remains a priority for the Society.

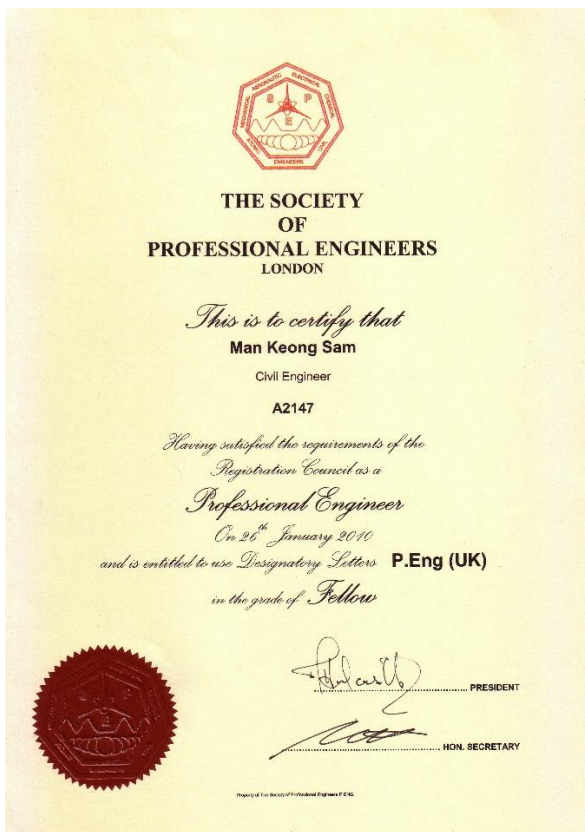
The Society created and maintains a Register of Engineers who can demonstrate knowledge and competence in engineering. Applicants who meet the Society's criteria for membership may use the designation "**P.Eng**".

The Society of Professional Engineers traces its origins to the Society of Engineers, which was founded in 1854 as a learned society. On 27 October, 1969, a number of the Society of Engineers' Corporate members formed the Society of Professional Engineers. (The original Society of Engineers was integrated in 2005 into the Institution of Incorporated Engineers, itself merging with the Institution of Electrical Engineers in 2006 to form the Institution of Engineering and Technology, the biggest professional engineering body in Europe).

In 2018 April, when The Society of Professional Engineers UK merged with Institution of Engineering and Technology, the international members of SPE-UK establish the Society of Professional Engineers UK & International and to keep the register of International Professional Engineers and their designations PEng,MSPE(UK &International) and PEng,MSPE(International)
