




### THE SINGAPORE EDUCATION LANDSCAPE

### Technical Education (ITE Colleges)

The **Institute of Technical Education** (**ITE**) is a post-secondary education institution and <u>statutory board</u> under the purview of the <u>Ministry</u> <u>of Education</u> in <u>Singapore</u>.

Established by the Ministry of Education, it was formerly known as Vocational and Industrial Training Board (VITB). ITE has three colleges, ITE College Central, ITE College East and ITE College West. It offers the Higher NITEC, Technical Diploma and Work-Study Diploma.

Apart from providing <u>vocational education</u> to <u>secondary school</u> graduates, ITE offers apprenticeships for the skilled trades and diplomas in vocational education for skilled technicians and workers in support roles in professions such as <u>accountancy</u>, <u>architecture</u>, <u>business</u> <u>administration</u>, <u>engineering</u> and <u>nursing</u>.

### History

### 1960s to 1970s: Vocational and Industrial Training Board (VITB)

During the 1960s and 1970s, <u>vocational education</u> was managed by two separate statutory boards, the Adult Education Board (AEB) and the Industrial Training Board (ITB). They were merged in 1979 to form the Vocational and Industrial Training Board (VITB). The VITB was formed to promote and develop vocational education.

### 1992: Institute of Technical Education (ITE)

The Institute of Technical Education (ITE) was established as a post-secondary education institution to improve the employability of vocational trainees and to restructure the VITB's programmes. The government decided that every student in Singapore had to have at least ten years of general education, with technically inclined students filtered into the <a href="Normal">Normal</a> (Technical) stream in secondary schools as preparation. These students would then attend the ITE after they finished secondary school education.

### Colleges

To refine technical education in Singapore, the "One ITE System, Three Colleges" Model of Education and Governance was introduced in 2005 to merge the 10 satellite campuses into 3 regional colleges.

The National University of Singapore (NUS) is a <u>national public research</u> <u>university</u> in <u>Singapore</u>. It was officially established in 1980 by the merging of the University of Singapore and <u>Nanyang University</u>.

The university offers degree programmes in disciplines at both the undergraduate and postgraduate levels, including in the sciences, medicine and dentistry, design and environment, law, arts and social sciences, engineering, business, computing, and music. NUS's main campus is located adjacent to the **Kent Ridge** subzone of Queenstown. 161 The Duke-NUS Medical School is located at the Outram campus. The Bukit Timah campus houses the Faculty of Law and Lee Kuan Yew School of Public Policy. NUS's affiliated faculty members and researchers include one Nobel Prize laureate, one Tang Prize laureate, and one Vautrin Lud laureate.

Nanyang Technological University (NTU) is a public <u>research</u> university in <u>Singapore</u>. Founded in 1981, it is also the second oldest <u>autonomous university</u> in the country.

The university is organised across numerous colleges and schools, including the College of Engineering, College of Science, Nanyang Business School, Lee Kong Chian School of Medicine, College of Humanities, Arts and Social Sciences, College of Computing and Data Science, Graduate College, National Institute of Education, and S. Rajaratnam School of International Studies. NTU is also home to two Research Centres of Excellence – the Singapore Centre on Environmental Life Sciences Engineering, and Institute for Digital Molecular Analytics and Science, and many University Research Institutes such as Earth Observatory of Science (which was a Research Centre of Excellence from June 2008 to June 2023, and transitioned to a University Research Institute in July 2023).

NTU's main campus covers 200 hectares (490 acres) of land, making it the largest university campus in Singapore.

The main campus is located in the western part of Singapore. Apart from its main campus, NTU also has a medical campus in <a href="Novena">Novena</a>, Singapore's healthcare district. As a large, comprehensive, university, it has 37,458 enrolled students, and 7,997 faculty and staff as of 2024.


### The Singapore Institute of

**Technology** (**SIT** or **Singaporetech**) is a <u>public</u> <u>autonomous</u> <u>university</u> in <u>Singapore</u>. The university offers industry-focused, applied degree programmes; it confers its own degree programmes as well as specialised degree programmes with overseas universities.


The university's degree programmes are grouped into five clusters: Engineering (ENG), Food, Chemical and Biotechnology (FCB), Infocomm Technology (ICT), Health and Social Sciences (HSS), and Business, Communication and Design (BCD).

The university's campus is located at 1 Punggol Coast Road in <u>Punggol</u>, within the <u>North-East Region</u> of the country. The centralised campus in <u>Punggol</u> is next to the new <u>Punggol Coast MRT station</u>. The university will be integrated with <u>Punggol Digital District</u> built by <u>JTC Corporation</u> in Punggol Downtown and Northshore district.

### SIT's centralised campus in Punggol in 2024.


